

303rd BG(H) Combat Mission No. 30

16 April 1943

Target: Power Station, Lorient, France

Crews Dispatched: 21

Length of Mission: 6 hours, 50 minutes

Bomb Load: 5 x 1,000 lb H.E. M44 bombs

Bombing Altitude: 26,700 ft

Ammo Fired: 37,450 rounds

Enemy Aircraft Claims: 4 destroyed, 1 probable

Maj. Glenn E. **Hagenbuch**, CO 427BS, flew #41-24619, *S for Sugar*, as lead B-17 of the Low Squadron.

Maj. Gene **Romig** led the 303rd BG(H) formation of 21 aircraft dispatched to bomb Lorient in *Knockout Dropper*, #41-24605 (359BS) BN-R. Five aircraft aborted the mission:

#42-5390, *The Avenger*, 360BS (Lt. **Clifton**). The air intake duct cracked at altitude and the manifold pressure dropped off.

#42-5483, *Red Ass*, 360BS (Lt. **Mack**). The No. 3 supercharger ran away.

#41-24587, *Bad Check*, 427BS (Lt. **Jacques**). The Nos. 2 and 4 engines ran excessively rough at altitude.

#41-24619, *S for Sugar*, 427BS (Maj. **Hagenbuch**). The No. 4 engine failed.

#41-29481, (*No Name*), 427BS (Lt. **Burch**). The tail guns were out and the No. 1 engine pressure was low.

The remaining sixteen aircraft bombed the primary target. Flak over the target was moderate and inaccurate. There were 20-25 single engine enemy fighters that attacked the Group in the vicinity of Lorient. B-17F #42-5360, *Old Faithful*, piloted by 1Lt. James **McDonald**, was badly damaged, but fought off the enemy aircraft, shooting down two.

Old Faithful was out of formation during the attack with its Nos. 1 and 3 engines running rough. The No. 2 engine failed internally, caught fire, and was extinguished by the CO₂ system. This engine was hit by 20mm shells after feathering. Twenty-mm shells also hit the wing between the Nos. 3 and 4 engines nacelles, cutting the prop cables and fuel line. The No. 3 engine oil pressure dropped to 40 pounds after the attack (75 pounds was normal). Armor plate at the waist gun position was pierced by three machine gun bullets. Lt. **McDonald** landed his badly damaged B-17 at RAF Predannack.

Lt. L.D. **Griffin** landed 360BS #42-5434 *Lady Luck* at Daordstowe with a supercharger out and a flat tire. All other aircraft returned to Molesworth with six stopping at Predannack for refueling.

The 1st Bomb Wing received no fighter support and Group gunners destroyed two enemy fighters with three others as probable and two damaged. The trailing 305BG

downed four planes with one probable and one damaged, losing one B-17 in the process. Maj. **Romig**, leading the 102 PBCW, believed that stacking the 305BG rather than normally trailing at the same altitude was partly responsible for spoiling the enemy fighter attack and preventing further B-17 losses. Maj. **Romig** also kept his airspeed down to assist some stragglers in the rear of the formation.

Lt. Ralph S. **Hayes**, during debriefing, said, "The bombs dropped in a good pattern, but they didn't hit the right place. The fighters were fairly persistent in their hit-and-run attacks, but didn't work us over today as they have in the past." Most crew members were unexcited about the mission. S/Sgt. Paul H. **Prescott**, waist gunner in the *Yardbird*, piloted by Capt. J.W. **Farrar**, was unperturbed about the fact that a 20mm shell had passed within two feet of his head. He said, "What the Hell. A miss is as good as a mile."

The experience of Lt. **McDonald** and his crew was an exception to the other crews, who weren't overly excited about the mission. Lt. **McDonald's** aircraft was so badly damaged that they had to land at a southern England field. "We lost one engine and received damage to two others on one of the first fighter attacks. From then on it was touch and go as to whether we would make it home. We couldn't stay with the formation after the enemy aircraft riddled us." His crew frankly admitted that if it hadn't been for the skill and courage of their pilot, they never would have made it back. 1Lt. James **Montgomery**, bombardier, said, "I've seen the light. I still can't believe that we are here. How in the world all those shells could pass through the nose of the ship and neither Clem (1Lt. R.W. **Clement**, navigator) nor myself got a scratch is a mystery to me." M/Sgt. J.E. **Bruskotter**, the ball turret gunner who expended all of his ammunition and claimed an enemy destroyed, said, "The turret was so full of empty shells that I could hardly move." "The pay off," **Montgomery** continued, "came when two FW-190s attacked us long after we were out to sea on the way home." We had jettisoned all but the upper turret guns and there were only 50 rounds left in them. We were ready for a crash landing in the water. Sgt. **Bruskotter** was closest to the upper turret and he operated it. The FW-190 made two passes at us and he got one of them. We were only 20 feet above the waves at the time and we all thought that it was curtains for us. If they'd known our condition, they could have finished us off in a hurry."

Four enemy aircraft kills and one probable were claimed during the mission. S/Sgt. R.W. **Sterling**, S/Sgt. J.E. **Bruskotter**, Lt. Robert J. **Yonkman** and S/Sgt. E.F. **Hairr** each were credited with an FW-190. Sgt. J. **Kerr** had a probable FW-190.

Crews again reported air to air bombs being used by the enemy fighters in an attempt to bomb our formation. The enemy bombs were described as being one third the size of a 100 pound bomb, silver colored, fat and short, one and one-half feet long and ten inches in diameter. The bombs had violent bursts estimated to be five or six times as large as a flak burst. The bombs were released from 1000 to 3000 feet above the formation and were accurate as to altitude but not as to deflection.
