Notice in the surprise and the Luftwaffe attack was described by one pilot as an "ambush." The nose attacks were not seen until the ME-109s were about 500 yards from the Group formation. Capt. George T. Mackin in *Miss Bea Haven* #42-5257 359BS, dropped his bombs in the vicinity of Gilze-Rijen. He left the formation and landed at Mildenhall.

Two Group aircraft were knocked down on the first pass. #41-24629 (*No Name*) 358BS, piloted by 1Lt. John W. **Hendry**, Jr., crashed near Valenciennes, France. Cannon shells from the ME-109s started a fire in the left wing gas tank. The order to bail out was given after the B-17 was in danger of quickly exploding from the gas tank fire. 2Lt. William B. **Harper** and T/Sgt. James J. **Brown** were killed. Lt. **Harper** is buried in Normandy American Cemetery near Coleville-sur-Mer, France. Lt. **Hendry**, 2Lt. Bernard T. **McNamara**, 2Lt. Richard E. **Webster**, T/Sgt. Loran C. **Biddle**, S/Sgt. Alfred J. **Hargrave**, Sgt. Delbert E. **Guhr**, S/Sgt. Wilmer G. **Raesley** and S/Sgt. John J. **Doherty** were captured and taken prisoner.

#42-29571, Charley Horse, 358BS, piloted by 2Lt. William R. Hartigan, crashed near Mons, Belgium. The aircraft was on fire and in a spin when last seen. It later blew up. Some parachutes were spotted. T/Sgt. Robert L. Ward and S/Sgt. John W. Lowther avoided capture and made contact with the French underground. They were taken to Paris and were accompanied by an Underground member on a train trip to the Swiss border. Eleven days after landing in Belgium, they were in Switzerland. T/Sgt. Ward worked for the U.S. Embassy before being returned in September, 1944. Lts. Hartigan and Douthett also evaded capture and were returned to Molesworth on 10 December, 1943. 2Lt. Edward N. Goddard, 2Lt. Bernard F. Dorsey, T/Sgt. Clement Resto, S/Sgt. Val F. Stoddard, S/Sgt. James T. Ince and Sgt. Ralph M. Moffett were captured and taken prisoner. S/Sgt. Charles J. Dove was killed.

During the descent, Maj. **Shayler** was instructed to "rejoin" the formation by the Combat Wing leader. Maj. **Shayler** informed the leader that he was "descending according to operational instructions." The Wing leader replied that he "didn't give a damn" what Maj. **Shayler** was doing, he wanted him to rejoin the formation. Maj. **Shayler** disregarded the instructions and came home with the 384th Group.


Maj. **Shayler** made the following report of the bomb run, following the loss of the two Group aircraft:

I called on VHF to the Combat Wing leader for instructions and received no reply. I fell into position in Combat Wing formation and followed the lead Group. Without warning, the lead ship fired a red flare and announced over VHF, "Turning on IP." I took interval and instructed my bombardier [2Lt. Fred **Clark**] to look for the target. We could not determine whether the target was going to be Weensdrecht or Gilze-Rijen. My bombardier picked up the airdrome at Gilze-Rijen and we started to make a bomb run on it. The lead Group fired a red flare and dropped a phosphorus bomb before the bomb release line, but I was unable to see any other bombs drop from the lead Group. My bombardier asked if he should drop his bombs and I instructed him not to, unless he was sure it was the target. We did not drop our bombs. The formation made a left turn, we fell in behind the 379th and began descent at 170 IAS and 500 FPM. The lead Group pulled away from us during the let-down and we returned home practically abreast of the 384th Group without difficulty, with the 379th Group out ahead.

In spite of the loss of two aircraft, fighter support was reported as excellent. Antiaircraft gunfire was very meager, with only scattered bursts along the route. During interrogation, the disappointed crews weren't a bit bashful in the crew comment complaints. Several crews complained about the lack of Combat Wing leadership and wanted to know why the bombs weren't dropped. Three crews wanted sandwiches at interrogation. One griped about the "no good" orange chocolate bars. Another said two men in his crew got sick from the "greasy French toast and bacon that they had for breakfast," and went on to say that the sandwiches today were very good. Others wanted more P-38 fighters.

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# 24 OCTOBER 1943 - AIR-SEA RESCUE MISSION

Ten Group aircraft took off between 0911 and 0916 on a low-level air-sea rescue mission. The crafts were in the air for approximately 6 1/2 hours. The search was uneventful--a parachute was observed on the water, a smoke bomb was seen near an Air-Sea Rescue float and an unmanned small raft with flag was spotted. The search was conducted at altitudes ranging from 300 to 800 feet.

# 30 OCTOBER 1943 - RECALLED MISSION

Target: Gelsenkirchen, Germany (PFF Mission)

The lead aircraft was a 482BG Pathfinder (PFF) B-17. The 303rd BG(H) was leading the 41st Combat Wing. A recall message was received about two hours after take-off. All 303rd BG(H) aircraft returned to Molesworth.
