ourteen aircraft, including two spares, took off to bomb the airdrome at Orly, France.
 The secondary target was an airdrome at Oreil, France. The two spare aircraft returned as ordered. No other aircraft returned early.

Twelve B-17s dropped 72 1,000-lb. M44 bombs from 24,000 feet with good results. Weather had no effect on the mission. There were no clouds in the target area, but some haze.

No enemy aircraft were seen. Moderate and inaccurate flak was encountered in the target area with some scattered fire along the route. No aircraft sustained any battle damage and there were no casualties. Friendly fighter support was excellent and it was considered that chaff had some beneficial effect.

Maj. Louis M. **Schulstad** reported, "The mission can be described in six words — good weather, good bombing, no opposition. There's no way we can make it sound exciting."

All aircraft returned safely to England, although Lt. **O'Beirne**, piloting #42-107097, Sweet Melody, 360BS, landed at Bradwell Bay with two engines out.

SURPRISE! — THERE IS A MILK RUN AMONGST MY MISSIONS Ed Miller's Memories and Recollections

We tried out a new type of formation today — a twelve aircraft formation with just two squadrons. I flew in the number 3 position off the lead aircraft, piloted by Major Louis M. Schulstad. My crew was the Cecchini crew as Tony was still not on flying status. But he had a very well qualified crew, which made it very simple for me — being a newcomer to their territory.

We bombed the airfield at Orly, France just outside of Paris. One would have thought that the Germans would have really stacked the area with anti-aircraft guns but we had little opposition from flak and no opposition at all from enemy aircraft.

The specific target was the Villacoublay Aircraft Works, an Orly Airdrome. We bombed visually and the results were good. We met meet no opposition from the air and flak was not a serious obstacle. But the weather on take-off out of Molesworth was the real bug-a-boo of this mission. We had such poor visibility that the 8th Air Force lost 5 B-17s and 3 B-24s that crashed on take-off, largely due to restricted visibility.

It sure was nice to have a "Milk Run" for a change — and not be headed for Berlin.
