

# 303rd BG (H) Combat Mission No. 185

19 June 1944

Target: Military Installations at Fiefs & Predefin, France

Crews Dispatched: 40

Length of Mission: 4 hours, 30 minutes

Bomb Load: 36 x 100 lb G.P. bombs

Bombing Altitude: 24,500 ft

Ammo Fired: 0 rounds

The afternoon mission was almost identical to the morning mission. The 303rd BG(H) dispatched two Groups of 20 aircraft. Clouds over the target were 7/10 to 8/10 with some breaks over the target. Bombing was again by "GEE-H" navigation equipment and 1,493 100-lb. G.P. M30 bombs were dropped from 24,000 and 24,500 feet. Results were poor – the bombs hit over and to the right of the target. There were no enemy fighters or flak. Friendly fighter support was poor – only a few were spotted. All aircraft returned safely to Molesworth.

Pilot 1Lt. John W. **Tulloss**, assigned to the 359BS on 11 Apr 1944, flew his required 31 missions as a lead crewman in 57 days (24 Apr to 19 Jun 1944) – an 8th AF record for completing a combat tour.

## From the book "25 Milk Runs" by Richard R. "Dick" Johnson

Although this afternoon's mission was considered a milk run, it was anything but that, as far as I was concerned. The lead plane in our group and others always carried a co-pilot in the tail gun position to check on formation. This was because a cockpit officer could name any ship by position to tell the lead pilot who might be out of formation.

Today was my turn in the barrel. I was assigned to fly with Captain R.S. Harrison and Captain R.P. Dubell in the 359th squadron's lead aircraft number 42-97291. They were leading the group in this afternoon's mission. The target was the same as this morning's mission, a Buzz bomb station near Fiefs and Predefin, which are in the Pas De Calais area.

My diary reads; "Pas De Calais, France. GH Robot Plane installations. Target five tenths covered. Same as this A.M.'s mission. Flew as tail gunner on lead ship to check formation. Temperature -26 degrees centigrade. Saw flak again, but no damage."

This brief description shows a milk run alright, but when I got into the tail gun position with electrically heated suit and gloves, I was out of my element. I made out OK during formation and departure, but when I was about settled down after advising the pilot that everything seemed good about the formation, I noticed that the AFCE (Automatic Flight Control Equipment) or Auto-Pilot which we called "George" was causing a good bit of movement at my new position. The swaying and yawing soon made me airsick. Not only that, I couldn't figure out how to fire the tail guns. I tried several times, finally giving up, as I figured that no enemy plane would attack from the rear, since all I could see behind me was hundreds of B-17s as far as the eye could see.

I soon developed the dry heaves, and it got so bad that I thought that I could barf my cookies with nothing to barf in. At that point I took off my flak helmet to use for that purpose, but managed to contain myself. It got to the point that I wouldn't have cared if I was shot down. I even contemplated taking off my oxygen mask for a while to see if that would ease the air sickness, but decided against it, since I knew that oxygen checks during all altitude flights, and when some one didn't answer, the nearest crew member took a walk-around oxygen bottle to check him out.

Beiser and most of our crew didn't fly this mission, and for a brief moment I was resentful for having been assigned this position. It gave me new respect for our tail gunner, Carroll H. Brackey. Ed Cooper was flying with 2nd Lt. D.D. Sayers on this mission, and David Glass, our assistant radio operator, right waist gunner, was flying with 1st Lt. A.G. Raistrick.

I guess it didn't help matters that gale force winds had arrived over the channel, making flying even bumpier than usual. The winds were so strong the next few days that the "Mulberry Harbor" at Omaha Beach was destroyed, and the British one was severely damaged. Parts of the American harbor were used to repair the one for the British at Arramanches. A large number of landing craft were also sunk during this stormy period.

A few missions later I had gone to the Key Club near the town of Molesworth for a little relaxation, knowing that I would not fly a mission the next day since our plane was down for repairs. I didn't get back to the barracks until about three a.m. and discovered with panic that the place was deserted. I quickly checked the manifest and saw that I was again assigned to fly tail gun position in the lead plane for an unexpected mission that morning.

I ran down to the briefing room, since breakfast was already over. I expected to be court martialled for missing a mission, so I ran to the operation's officer for the 427th squadron, Major Schulstad, and told him I was ready to go. He said, "Oh, that's OK, we found somebody to take your place." I couldn't believe that anyone could be so casual about somebody being AWOL, as it were. It paid off for me, since I never had to fly tail gun but the one time. I hadn't told them about my near fatal airsickness and I can imagine what would have happened to me if I had taken this flight today. After having a "few" drinks and no breakfast, I would have been in prime shape for a major barf.

Our attempts to destroy the launching sites were largely failures, since the sites were small and easily hidden. Nearly two thousand allied airmen died in the eighty days of these interdiction assaults. Also, over six thousand civilians were killed by these bombs, and nearly eighteen thousand were injured. These flying bombs traveled at four hundred miles per hour, and only the British Meteor, a jet propelled fighter could catch one. Yet, with over two thousand anti-aircraft guns, some with proximity fuses, nearly twenty-five hundred of these weapons fell on London and the same amount on Antwerp, Belgium after its capture by allied ground troops.
