## 303rd BG (H) Combat Mission No. 204

16 July 1944

Target: City area, Munich, Germany

Crews Dispatched: 20

Length of Mission: 8 hours, 45 minutes Bomb Load: 10 x 500 lb G.P. M43 bombs

> Bombing Altitude: 27,700 ft Ammo Fired: 0 rounds

unich was beginning to be an old story to combat crews as 303rd BG(H) bombers continued in their fourth July attack on Munich. The twenty B-17s that took off flew in the low Group position of 41st CBW. Capt. William E. **Eisenhart**, 359BS, led the 303rd BG(H) formation. One aircraft returned early: #42-38050 *Thunderbird*, 359BS (Lt. **Jenkins**), sustained a No. 4 supercharger waste gate failure. The remaining 19 Fortresses dropped 190 500-lb. G.P. M43 bombs from 27,700 feet. PFF bombing was used due to 10/10 undercast.

There were no enemy aircraft observed. Fighter support was reported as good. A few crews stated that it was spotty immediately after the target – but only for 30 to 35 minutes. Flak over the target was intense and accurate. Meager but accurate flak was encountered at Ghent and observed at several other points. Crews reported that chaff had only slightly beneficial effect. Two aircraft sustained major and seven, minor damage.

Fortress #42-97284 (*No Name*), 359BS, piloted by 1Lt. Walter J. **Carney**, was badly damaged over Munich. He was able to fly his aircraft to a friendly airfield in Italy. Following his return, Lt. **Carney** received commendation letters from Lt. Gens. Carl **Spaatz** and James H. **Doolittle** and Maj. Gen. Robert B. **Williams** (CG IBD) for a job well done by a combat pilot.

## Gen. **Spaatz** wrote:

The fact that you have shown expert airmanship and a great deal of determination in bringing your badly damaged aircraft across the Alps and to a friendly Italian base has been brought to my attention.

I wish to commend you for this display of perseverance in saving the government valuable property and personnel. Such an example is indicative of a high state of morale and will be an inspiration to other combat crews finding themselves in similar circumstance.

## **MUNICH, GERMANY (CITY AREA - PFF BOMBING)**

After a nine-day break, the Arnold crew resumed flying by making one of their longest trips into Germany. The nearly nine-hour flight (5:25a.m.-1:59p.m.) to the southern city of Munich involved more than six hours of flying over enemy territory. Robert Marbel served as co-pilot. Sgt. Donald E. Skinner, an aerial photographer, also joined the crew on this mission aboard the Bonnie B. Skinner apparently had little, if any, flying experience. His difficulties using the oxygen mask caused him to black out several times.

A heavy cloud front over Munich prevented the planes from attacking the primary visual target which was the Bayerische Motorenwerks (BMW) plant that produced engines, including the jet engines used in the ME-163 jet fighter. Instead, the formation used the PFF radar navigation system to bomb a military site located in downtown Munich. Civilian casualties almost certainly occurred as a result.

The Arnold crew reported intense but inaccurate flak over the target at 9:47a.m. from their altitude of 26,300 feet. Meager but more accurate flak was encountered over Ghent, Belgiium at 12:31p.m. while flying home at 19,000 feet. The Bonnie B lagged behind the formation for an hour and a half before and after the target because one engine had shut down due to bechanical problems and two others ran rough. Arnold probably was able to catch up with the group by flying more direct routes and pushing the remaining three engines to their limit. The crew reported seeing lots of traffic in the railway yards of northeast France and seeing six large transport ships in Rotterdam harbor.
