Target: Marshalling Yard at Aschaffenburg, Germany

single Squadron of thirteen Fortresses was dispatched to attack a locomotive shed at Aschaffenburg, Germany. The secondary target was the marshalling yard itself. B-17G #42-97546 *Idaliza*, 360BS (Lt. **Goodberlet** 358BS) returned early with engine problems.

Ten aircraft dropped 90 500-lb. H.E. M43, 18 500-lb. M17 incendiary bombs and nine units of T29 leaflets on the secondary target from 21,300 feet. The PFF bombing results were unobserved. There was no enemy opposition, no flak, no battle damage and good 1st AD support by 112 P-52s.

What started out as a "milk run" mission turned deadly when two aircraft collided at 48E27'N- 80E20'E, the turning point before reaching the IP. The left wing of Squadron lead aircraft #44-8137 (*No Name*), 359BS, piloted by 1Lt. Richard B. **Duffield**, caught the right wing of #42-97058, *Scorchy II*, 359BS, piloted by 2Lt. Richard E. **Tasker**, the lead aircraft of the 2nd flight. The wing of #44-8137 came off and the aircraft rolled over on its back and went down. *Scorchy II* also lost its wing and went down. No parachutes were spotted by other 303rd BG(H) crews, although some crews of the nearby 39BS reported seeing some parachutes and bodies falling out. Sgt. David **Garza**, in #44-6316, 358BS,

observed the disabled aircraft as it fell to the ground. The aircraft crashed near Rottweil, Germany. 1Lt. Jack W. **Weaver**, Deputy Leader, took over the lead in #44-8676 (*No Name*), 427BS with a 360BS, crew after the collision of the lead aircraft.

1Lt **Duffield**, 1Lt Richard H. **Cambron**, 1Lt Gene K. **Shipp**, 1Lt Thomas E. **Wilson**, T/Sgt Raymond **Levine**, T/Sgt Donald R. **Christ**, S/Sgt John C. **Elliott**, S/Sgt Phillip W. **Hensel** and 2Lt. Raymond E. **White** were killed in the crash. Lt. **Cambron** is buried in Lorraine American Cemetery near Moselle, France. 1Lt James C. **Flemmons** was captured and became a Prisoner of War.

2Lt **Tasker**, 2Lt Angelito **Francis**, F/O Clyde **Meadows**, 2Lt William D. **Toon**, S/Sgt Bruce H. **Hinnershots**, Sgt Paul B. **Kapczynski**, Sgt Charles S. **Van Ornum** and Sgt. Carl R. **Hurlbutt** were killed in the crash of their aircraft. Sgt **Van Ornum** is buried in Lorraine American Cemetery near Moselle, France. Sgt Arthur H. **Driver** was captured and became a Prisoner of War.

Sgt. Arthur H. **Driver** in the POW airman transit camp at Wetzler, Germany. Sgt **Driver** gave Sgt. **Geng** an account of his escape in the loss of *Scorchy II*: Sgt. **Driver** saw the tail of *Scorchy II* severed from the main body by a wingman flying slightly behind it as the turn was being on to the IP. Sgt. **Driver** managed to exit the tumbling tail through the tail escape door. He fell with his quick, attachable 'chute pack tied to the parachute with a three-foot piece of rope. He hauled in his 'chute and attached one side to the harness. He then pulled the rip cord without attaching the other side since the ground was very close. He made a hard landing, but was not injured. He was captured shortly after landing. Several days after his capture, the Germans showed him several identification dog tags that were recovered from a B-17 wreckage. They were the tags of his crew members. He believed that he was the only crew member to survive.

TWO B-17s COLLIDE IN MID-AIR by Lt. John S. Proffitt, Jr

During my crew's combat tour at Molesworth, we had several exciting experiences, all of which were thankfully rather mild. We lost an engine over the target – we had to abort because of a sheared propeller shaft – we had to land without a tailwheel when the worn gear was damaged by flak – we ran off the runway when landing because the hydraulic line between the brakes pedal and the wheels had been damaged by flak – we landed at English bases on several occasions because of low gas and we had a bomb snag up in the bomb bay over the target which we had to kick out. But, the most unusual experience was witnessing the collision of two B-17s on our 21 January 1945 mission to Aschaffenburg, Germany.

We were flying on Lt. Tasker's left wing, and I was consciously observing the situation before and at the time of the collision. Lt. Duffield, the squadron leader, let his IAS increase to about 160 miles per hour in the left turn. Upon completion of the turn, he immediately reduced his airspeed, and Tasker put down some flaps, causing the left side of his plane to raise up and made contact with Duffield. While I had been watching this entire event develop right in front of me, the actual collision was unexpected.

My first realization of the seriousness of the situation was when a landing gear wheel from one of the planes nearly hit my right wing. My instant reaction was to peel off to the left, so both planes were on their way down by the time I saw them again.

Since we generally expected that everyone involved in the collision had perished, my tail gunner, S/Sgt Howard F. O'Neal, was surprised to encounter Tasker's tail gunner, S/Sgt A. H. Driver, on the ship when returning to the U. S., a few months later. Witnessing two B-17s colliding in mid-air, only a hundred or so, feet ahead of you certainly qualifies as an unusual experience.
