Statement of Captain Robert J. Lynch, O-25414

On the mission to Wizernes, France, I was co-pilot of A/C #42-97405 which was the lead A/C in the 303rd Bomb Group formation. While over enemy territory, the A/C received a direct hit from A/A gunfire in #1 and #2 engines. #2 engine immediately went out and we were unable to feather the propellor. After we reached the enemy coast on the way out from the target, I signalled the deputy leader to take over because we could not feather the propellor and the engine was causing the plane to vibrate badly. Under the circumstances it seemed best to head directly for Beachy Head, the nearest point on the English coast, rather than follow the briefed route. Not far from the English coast the #2 engine exploded so I ordered the crew to bail out as it was impossible to go any further. We were about five to ten miles off Beachy Head when I left the A/C. I am sure the others in the crew went out before I did. I landed in the water and was rescued by a corvette which was nearby. Four others on the crew were saved by two destroyers. They are the following: S/Sgt. Kenneth R. Krogh, S/Sgt. Josef R. Chudej, T/Sgt. Frank R. Schuler, and T/Sgt. Thomas M. Roszell. One of the destroyers also recovered the body of 1st Lt. Lawrence D. Ross who was dead. As to the other four on the crew, they are still missing. Unless by some remote chance, they were taken to France on some boat, it is my opinion that they could not have survived. I was told that the A/C itself blew up shortly before it hit the water. It was about 1130 hours when I landed in the water, and I was picked up some 45 minutes later. The weather was clear and visibility was good at the time.





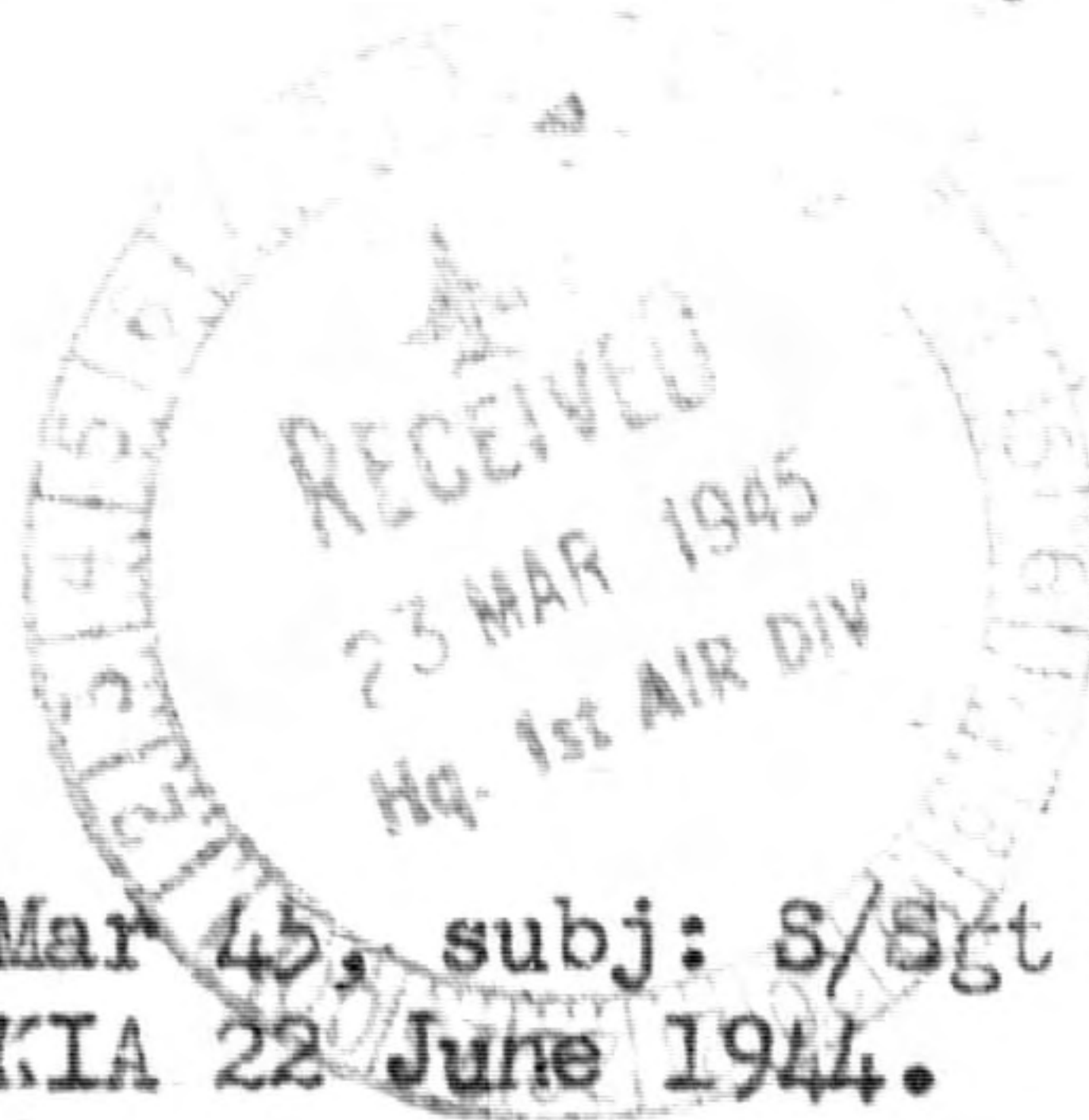

Since my Son probably wont be able to tell us this we hope that you can - and also, please tell us how many raids or missions my Son participated in up to his death, which we find very difficult to take.

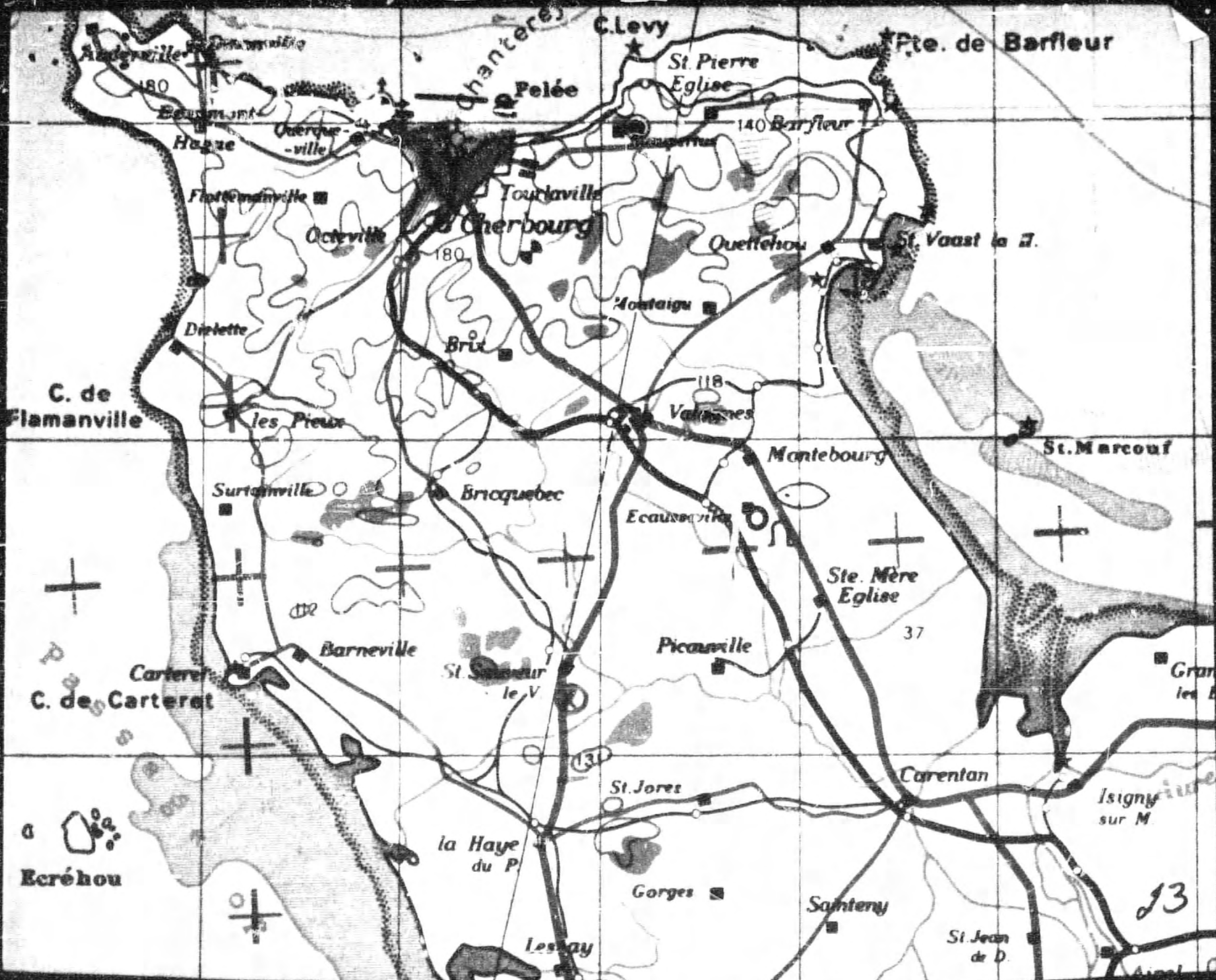
